#### Christ The Man

Luke – the physician - was a Greek, a companion and loyal friend of Paul. He writes to Theophilus who is also a Greek to more fully explain the Christian faith.

<u>Date Written:</u>	Approximately 60 AD
<u>Place Written</u>	Rome and possibly Caesarea
<u>Audience:</u>	Theophilus (one who loves God), Gentiles
<u>Places:</u>	Bethlehem, Galilee, Judea, and Jerusalem.

6. Luke 24:49 - How long did the disciples have to wait?
